Topics for Swaraj Gyan Panchayat

1. Food Swaraj and Farmers' Movement

- a. Food Swaraj is an arrangement for ensuring nutritious food for every human being
- b. To enable Food Swaraj, the production of food grains must be independent of the market
- c. In the creation of policies for food, we must ensure the participation of Farmer and Women communities. Panchayats at the Block level may be organized to formulate policies for attaining Food Swaraj that are based on Knowledge
- d. The storage and processing of food grains and Dals should be localized and in the hands of small and family entrepreneurs. Women should get priority in these enterprises.
- e. Extensive cultivation of JAU (??), Bajra, Jowar, Ragi and other similar millets/local grains must be encouraged.
- f. Sea-food production must be organized around local practices, knowledge and needs.
- g. All techniques and technology to be implemented in growing food crops must necessarily be widely discussed and understood by the farmer Society beforehand.
- h. Those working in the areas of agriculture and associated with food must be paid salaries on par with Government servants.

2. Economic Measures for Poverty Eradication

- a. Local markets must be strengthened based on local employment.
- b. Precedence must be given to local knowledge and skills in these markets
- c. We must ensure that not less than 80% of the goods sold in local markets is from the locality
- d. Cooperation and not competition must be the motto of economic activity (MAYBE NOT A CORRECT TRANSLATION??)
- e. Tax policy and currency policies must be changed in line with local market needs

- 3. Social Justice and providing a Central place for Knowledge
 - a. Knowledge, Income and Livelihood (/ Employment)

 - c. At the local level, "Bhaichara" Panchayats of different communities must be established
